The main entrance has automatic doors. All entrances and exits are wheelchair accessible. The building has only one level, so there are no lifts.

### **Pets**

Dogs are welcome in the outdoor areas. There is a water fountain in the playground near the pizza oven. Dog bags are behind the blue bin in the front car park. Assistant animals are welcome inside the building.

### **What to wear**

Wear whatever makes you feel comfortable. The parking area and building floors are flat, but the grass areas outside can be uneven. It is a good idea to wear comfortable shoes.

### **Parking**

There is free parking at the centre. There are two accessible parking spaces and about 40 parking spaces near the main entrance. There is also free street parking on Hessing Crescent, Brack Court, and Insley Court.

### Public Transport

#### Bus

- Bus route 682 stops at Stop 54A on Heysen Drive. This stop is about a 550 metre walk to the centre. The area is hilly, so the walk may take a little longer.

#### Train

- The nearest train station is Hallett Cove Beach. It is about 5 km away. You can take bus 682 from the station to Stop 54A.

#### Taxi

- Taxis can drop people off at the front of the building near the accessible parking.


### Toilets

There are toilets inside the building near the main entrance. There is also an accessible toilet with grab rails, accessible sinks, and a baby change room. Public toilets are also available near the Southland Community Tennis Club.

### **Kitchen**

Coffee, tea, and hot or cold water are available in the kitchen. The kitchen is on the right after you enter through the main entrance.

### **Playground**

There is a playground next to the centre on Hessing Crescent. It is open 24 hours a day and is suitable for children aged 0 to 12 years.

The playground includes slides, swings, climbing equipment, musical play items, and shaded areas.

### **Nature walk**

There are several reserves and walking paths around Trott Park. The full walking trail is about 5 km long. The area is hilly, so please take care while walking.
