Kaurna people welcome you to Warriparinga

Warriparinga is an important sacred place for Kaurna people. The spirit of Tjilbruke lives here. The spirit of the wind visits here. The spirit of the river makes us alive.

This place is a law ground and burial area. On the path you will travel, the land tells about Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people, the bush, animals, plant foods and the river. Come in, go near, listen, explore, and look around.

## Warriparinga Bushtucker History and Music Workshop

**\*\*Suitable for all ages\*\***

This 1 ½ hour walking workshop is suitable for small to large sized groups and includes an easy walk through the Warriparinga park and wetlands. A Cultural Officer guide will help you to appreciate the natural environment of Warriparinga and the Sturt River. Understand the history of Warriparinga and the significance of Warriparinga and Dreaming stories.

### Students will learn about:

- Interpretation of the importance of Warriparinga to Kurna people
- Introduction to Warriparinga and the importance of the area to the Kurna people and European Settlers
- History of Fairford House and the Coach House
- Impact of European settlement to Warriparinga and the Kurna people
- Introduction to Indigenous language and the connection of culture to language.
- Introduction to Dreaming Stories
- Introduction to native plants, seasonal bush tucker and traditional bush medicine
- An appreciation of the variety of plants and animals that are supported by the environment at Warriparinga
- Scar trees at Warriparinga
- An appreciation of the variety of plants and animals that are supported by the environment at Warriparinga.
- Warriparinga Wetlands ponds information
- Introduction to Aboriginal Music – Instruments and Song





### **Art Workshop**

**\*\*Suitable for year 3 through to adults\*\***

Do you want to learn about Aboriginal art, do you understand the symbols you see on Aboriginal paintings? If not, this is the workshop for you. Our “Artist in Residence” will give you an introduction to Aboriginal art in addition to assisting you to create your own “work of art” to take home.

This 1 ½ hour workshop requires a minimum of 10 and a maximum of 25 (age dependent) participants and will include the following;

- Introductory talk about Aboriginal art and craft (different art forms, materials)
- Hear about dreaming stories and find out how they tie in with today's paintings
- Guided tour of current artworks displayed in the gallery (optional)
- Understanding and interpreting Aboriginal art symbols
- Hands-on painting by students
- Walk to the bridge to see the aerosol art (when permitted)

## **Weaving workshop with the Southern Elders Weaving Group**

**\*\*Suitable for year 3 through to adults\*\***

This 1-hour workshop includes weaving and teachings from our local Southern Elders Weaving Group. With their knowledge, life and cultural traditions you will learn about different techniques, materials & history – all to do with their personal experience in weaving and practicing cultural traditions. The Weaving Workshops will help your students to appreciate and become more aware of aboriginal culture and indigenous history.

- Introductory talk about Aboriginal Weaving and crafts
- Guided tour of current artworks displayed in the gallery (optional)
- Understanding and interpreting Aboriginal Weaving
- Hands-on Weaving by students
- Different Techniques & Materials

***Note: Workshops are customized to suit individual group requirements and ages***



## Workshop Times

- Warriparinga History and Environment tour, Art and Weaving Workshops are regularly run on weekdays – bookings essential.
- Native Plant Bushtucker Kurna Culture and Music Workshop runs Monday to Wednesday – bookings essential.
- Times are flexible through the day – depending on availability
- Gallery hours are from 10.00am to 4.00pm Mon to Fri

\$21.50 Adult per person per workshop


**Art Workshop:** \$12.80 Student/Concession per person per workshop

## How to get to Warriparinga

The Living Kaurna Cultural Centre is located only 20 minutes south of the city at Warriparinga, corner of Marion and Sturt roads, Bedford Park. The entrance is off Sturt Rd – in between the Sturt Police station and the Marion Caravan Park – Warriparinga Way.

The Living Kaurna Cultural Centre is easily accessible by public transport. Tonsley train station is only a 5-minute walk from the Centre. Regular buses depart from Westfield Marion with a bus stop on Sturt Road not far from the entry to Warriparinga. Ample parking is available as well as coach and bus parking at the end of the Warriparinga access road (on the bitumen).
